

A Time To Pray

RBMCC Hosts Day-Long Prayer Retreat February 26th

2018 will be a year in which RBMCC will devote a lot of time and attention to improving our personal and our church's prayer life. To kick-off this time of intentional growth, we will be hosting a day-long spiritual retreat that is free and open to anyone. The day will begin at 9:00 am with a period of silent meditation and centering. Rev. Eric Buter and our own Freda Hellerstein will be teaching segments on how to pray and be open to hearing God's voice as well as the different types of prayer styles. Andy Verostek will lead an hour-long prayer round table session in which we will pray in waves from covering individuals in our community all the way to covering our human family. Much of our activities this day will be spent in small groups so that we can get to know one another and focus our

energies on learning from and guiding each other through the day's events. Breakfast, lunch and snacks will be provided. We will close the day at 6:00 pm to allow for people to continue in



fellowship if they so choose or to head out into the world feeling revitalized and renewed.

Please come prepared to share in one another's faith journeys as we commit to deepening our prayer connections with one another.

2017 Financial Review

It's no secret we have some steep bills to pay. Last year, our annual rent totaled \$51,798.74. Our electric bill was \$1,120.46 for the year and our gas bill was \$201.53. Our annual phone and internet charges were \$2,275.68, keeping in mind we are charged commercial, not residential, rates for these services. And none of those funds account for the various ministries we support and the numerous in-kind donations that happen humbly behind the scenes to ensure our church functions. Our total expenses in 2017: \$71,228.69

Yet amidst all of these financial hurdles we have a reason to celebrate: RBMCC ended the year with a deficit of only -\$600.46 versus our total annual income of \$70,628.23. That is in and of itself an answer to many prayers. You see, our budget that we set at the 2016 Congregational Meeting forecasted a deficit of -\$19,683.44, which means there was over \$19,000 in additional giving that was not anticipated the year prior. Putting it more bluntly, in 2016, our congregation was heading into a year in which we had no idea how we were going to make ends meet, yet God provided through your stewardship.

This means that each person, whether they gave \$5 or a large onetime offering, has contributed to closing the gap. Your faithfulness to this church and to the vision and ministry here at RBMCC is exemplified in the faithfulness to which each of us has committed to the stewardship of what God has entrusted to us.

In 2018 we will need to make a decision about staying in or leaving our space. Please be in prayer over this decision that God will continue to provide for our needs, whether here or elsewhere.

This year will mark the first time in a while that RBMCC has hosted an Ash Wednesday Service which will take place Wednesday, February 14th at 7:00 pm. Our service will lead into a new study group series that will last 5-6 weeks during the time of Lent. It will focus on how we, as modern Christians, can prepare our hearts for the events that took place nearly 2,000 years ago on Maundy Thursday, Jesus' crucifixion on Good Friday and ultimately his resurrection on Easter Sunday.
